- **Microchips:** The Whatcom Humane Society will microchip your pets year round for just \$20.00 on a walk-in basis.
- **Dog Licensing & Rabies:** The annual license fee for each unsterilized male or female dog over 4 months of age is \$41.00. The annual license fee for each sterilized dog or cat is \$11.00. Before a license is issued for any dog, the owner must certify under penalty of perjury that the dog has been vaccinated against rabies, or, at the time of licensing, a rabies vaccine can be given by the Whatcom Humane Society staff. - **SNAP (Spay Neuter Assistance Program):** For low income pet owners.
- FREE Spay/Neuter Assistance Program for Lummi/Nooksack tribal members (**must have Tribal ID Verification**).
